**For reference the applicable CUSC objectives are:**

- That compliance with the use of system charging methodology facilitates effective competition in the generation and supply of electricity and (so far as is consistent therewith) facilitates competition in the sale, distribution and purchase of electricity;*
- That compliance with the use of system charging methodology results in charges which reflect, as far as is reasonably practicable, the costs (excluding any payments between transmission licensees which are made under and accordance with the STC) incurred by transmission licensees in their transmission businesses and which are compatible with standard licence condition C26 requirements of a connect and manage connection);*
- That, so far as is consistent with sub-paragraphs (a) and (b), the use of system charging methodology, as far as is reasonably practicable, properly takes account of the developments in transmission licensees' transmission businesses;*

1	Do you believe that the CMP345 Original solution, WACM1, WACM2, WACM3, WACM4, WACM5, WACM6, WACM7 or WACM8 better facilitates the Applicable CUSC Objectives?	<p>We believe that the CMP 345 Original solution better facilitates the applicable CUSC Objectives (A) and (C).</p> <p>Deferring a portion of the covid costs and socialising the said cost to the entirety of the subsequent charging year is fair and less discriminatory. It maintains effective competition in the generation and supply of electricity, as effective competition should not be based on parties' ability absorb unforeseeable risks arising from the pandemic.</p> <p>The original solution better facilitates CUSC objective C as it properly takes account of developments in transmission businesses resulting from COVID. It makes a better effort at softening the impact of the System Operator's covid-related costs on transmission licensees' businesses.</p>
