

Latest forecast (Summary)	Met Office SEPA Natural Resources Wales	Today: A widely cloudy start with outbreaks of rain affecting western areas, this sometimes persistent and heavy across the southwest. Elsewhere some patchy drizzle, though drier and brighter in the east, with some sunshine in sheltered spots. Breezy and feeling humid. Tonight: Turning drier in the far southwest, though hill fog developing across the Moors. Widely cloudy elsewhere with further scattered showers spreading into western and northern parts overnight. Feeling rather muggy.
