



Cloudier elsewhere with scattered showers, these heavy, perhaps thundery across Northern Ireland and parts of central and northern England. Feeling warm and humid in the east. Tonight: Cloudy with occasional outbreaks of rain in the west and north. Drier and clear for central and eastern parts, isolated showers developing by the morning. Warm and muggy for many.
