1. Introductions, Apologies and Declarations of Interest

12907. Apologies were received from Penny Garner and Joe Colebrook.

2. Minutes from previous meeting

12908. The meeting minutes from 02 May and 15 May were approved. The minutes from the Panel held on 23 May and Special Panel on 09 June will be subject to approval at the meeting on 25 July 2025.

12909. The CUSC Panel reviewed the open actions from the meeting held on 23 May, which can be found on the Actions Log.

12911. NH provided an update on Modifications that have been decided upon, together with those currently awaiting their decision.

Other Updates

12913. NH advised the Panel that on 11 March, the Authority has published a decision on Code Manager selection. Alongside the decision, the Authority has published their updated guidance on Code Public 4 Manager selection after consideration of stakeholder feedback. Ofgem is planning to begin the selection process for phase 2 codes as soon as possible and will share more information in due course.

6. New modifications

12914. Two new modifications were presented to the Panel.

CMP454: CMP434 / CMP435 Section 11 changes

- 12915. Following the Authority's decision on approving CMP434/CMP435 on 15 April 2025, two resultant definition changes are recommended to CUSC Section 11 to define concepts of "Gated Offers" and "Variations Clause" as respectively used in the CMP434/CMP435.
- 12916. Prior to the Panel meeting, Panel Members raised some concerns with the proposed legal text for CMP454, however following confirmation from the Proposer and agreement by other Panel Members, the Panel agreed unanimously that CMP454 should follow the Self governance route and proceed to Code Administrator Consultation.

CMP455: Minor Amendments to the CUSC following the implementation of CMP434/CMP435

- 12917. The Panel also discussed the proposed timeline for CMP453, noting that the proposed implementation date is 01 April 2026. CG advised the Panel that under CMP292, a decision would be required by 30 September. HH stated that the date of 30 September is a target date, not a requirement, therefore this wouldn't preclude a decision or implementation.
- 12918. The Panel unanimously agreed that CMP453 should follow the Fast Track Self governance route.





7. In flight modification updates

12919. CG talked the Panel through the progression of the in-flight modifications. The inflight modifications can be found within the CUSC Panel papers pack via the following link: Modification Tracker

CMP316: TNUoS Arrangements for Co-located Generation Sites

12920. CG advised the Panel that following the Authority send-back, the Workgroup focused mainly on simplifying the legal text for the modification to aid in stakeholder understanding. While reviewing the legal text, an omission was identified in the previous legal text, meaning that the solution and legal text did not match for WACM1. Therefore, the scaling of ALFs was incorporated into the latest version of legal text.

12921. CG noted that the Workgroup concluded by majority (4 out of 5) that the Original better facilitated the Applicable Objectives than the Baseline, and unanimously that WACMI better facilitated the Applicable Objectives than the Baseline. The Panel agreed that following the send back decision, the CMP316 has met the Terms of Reference and can proceed to its Second Code Administrator Consultation.

CMP417: Extending principles of CUSC Section 15 to all Users

12922. The Panel approved the amended Terms of Reference as submitted within the Panel Papers.

<u>CMP440</u>: Re-introduction of Demand TNUoS locational signals by removal of the zero-price floor

12923. The Panel discussed the proposed amended timeline for CMP440. There was a consensus that while the implementation might be delayed to February 2026, it is crucial to send the right signal to the industry. The proposed timeline suggests getting the Final Modification Report submitted to Ofgem by November 2025, with a decision expected by March 2026. However, some Panel Members were in agreement that the signal's importance outweighs the implementation date, also acknowledging the need for adequate notice periods for suppliers and the implementing the changes into the CUSC within the proposed timeframe. The



Panel approved the new timeline for CMP440, however agreed that the decision date should be amended to 30 March 2026.

The next Modification Tracker will be published on 07 July.

8. Workgroup Reports

12924. No Workgroup Reports were presented to the Panel.

9. Draft Final Modification Reports

12925. The following Draft Final Modification Report was presented to the Panel:

CMP344: Clarification of Transmission Licensee revenue recovery and the treatment of revenue adjustments in the Charging Methodology

- 12926. This modification proposes that the additional revenue allowances for Offshore Transmission Owners (OFTOs) in relation to Income Adjustment Events (IAEs) should be recovered from all demand Users, rather than the Generator directly affected.
- 12927. CG advised the Panel that the third Code Administrator Consultation was run from 09 May 02 June 2025 and received 2 non-confidential responses. Key points were:
 - One respondent felt CMP344 better supports objectives d), e), and h) by simplifying cost recovery and improving fairness for offshore generators. The other questioned whether the CUSC process is the right place for such a major policy shift, suggesting it should be handled under the CfD regime.
 - One respondent preferred the baseline solution, while another supported the original proposal. Similarly, views on the implementation approach were divided, with one in agreement and the other not.
 - One Respondent expressed concerns about a proposed shift in transmission network charging policy related to revenue adjustments from IAEs, suggesting that such issues should be addressed within the CfD regime rather than through the CUSC modification process, while also urging OFGEM to make timely decisions before AR7 to reflect appropriate risk premiums in CfD.

- 12928. Prior to holding their recommendation vote, Panel Members debated the merits of voting in isolation versus having detailed discussions before holding their recommendation vote. It was noted that recent changes have involved debates followed by votes, and there was a suggestion to discuss the advantages and disadvantages of pre-populating voting statements. The Panel agreed to add a reflection slide before the vote and to review the process for handling modifications with multiple WACMs. **ACTION**
- 12929. The Panel agreed by majority that CMP344 better meets the objectives than the baseline. (Post meeting note: The Final Modification Report was submitted to the Authority on 09 July 2025).

10. Discussion on Prioritisation

12930. The Panel carried out a monthly review of the prioritisation stack, taking into consideration feedback from industry participants, the CUSC Panel agreed the following changes to the prioritisation stack:

12933. GG confirmed that the JESG meeting due to be held on 13 May was cancelled. The next JESG meeting will be held on 10 June.

- 12935. CG advised the Panel that a consequential CUSC Modification as a result of <u>GC0168</u>: Submission of Electro Magnetic Transient (EMT) Models has been raised, however the Code Administrator is working with the Proposer to further develop the proposal before it is formally raised at a Panel meeting.

12936. No further updates for the Panel.

16. Horizon Scan

12938. CG presented the Horizon Scan to the Panel. The Panel had no further comments on this.

17. Code Administrator Update

CUSC Panel Elections 2025

12939. CG advised the Panel that the CUSC Modification Panel Elections are due to take place this year. CG stated that communications regarding the elections will be sent to industry on 30 June 2025. GG questioned if there should be a proposal raised to extend the term of the election, considering ECR timescales. JW noted it would be sensible to be transparent to industry regarding any changes and



requested that the Code Administrator ensures consistent messaging regarding the elections.

CUSC Panel Dates for 2026

12940. CG provided the Panel with an update on the proposed CUSC Panel dates for 2026. All Panel Members agreed with the proposed dates for 2026.

18. Any Other Business (AOB)

Recruitment update for Independent Chairperson

12941. CG provided the Panel with an overview of the process for the appointment of the new Independent Chairperson. CG explained that Panel Members can be involved with the interview panel and then a recommendation will be put forward to the Authority for approval. CG stated that while the recruitment process is underway for the Independent Chairperson, a Senior Manger from NESO will act as the interim Independent Chair, this is in line with Section 8.7.1. CG confirmed that the Independent Chairperson will be recruited for both the CUSC and Grid Code Review Panel.

Gate 2 Connections Reforms

12942. JD provided feedback on the Gate 2 Connection reforms, highlighting the need for consistent treatment and mechanisms to support legacy issues. JD mentioned that there are still significant delays persist, with customers struggling to speak to someone directly, and the portal is inadequate. GG added that the FAQs should include information about the new portal, and DA took an action to get an answer for PJ.

CMP448 Further Analysis

- 12943. NH advised the Panel that the analysis, which was intended to be submitted with the CMP448 Final Modification Report on 04 July includes two parts: one that NESO had planned to submit, and another requested by Ofgem. While the first part is on track, the second part may not be ready by the deadline, potentially causing timeline issues. GG raised concerns about the evidence Ofgem will use for its decision-making and the need for additional analysis that the Workgroup hasn't seen.
- 12944. A Panel Member noted that as there have been no legal text changes identified following the Code Administrator Consultation, the governance rules do not allow for Panel to direct that this needs to go back to Workgroup, this would need to





follow the process through and a formal send – back directed by the Authority. The Panel also agreed that input from the Authority would be required on the timescales for getting CMP448 through the process if the Panel are unable to hold their recommendation vote as per the approved timeline.

19. Close

12945. The Chair thanked the Panel for their time and contribution and brought the meeting to a close.

The next CUSC Panel meeting will be held on 25 July.
