



Tonight: Showers die down across Scotland leaving a chilly night with mist and patchy frost. Heavy rain spreads north and eastwards across England, Wales and Northern Ireland. 		- Spray and flooding on roads leading to difficult driving conditions and increased
		chance of accidents, making journey times longer - Public transport affected in places with some journey times taking longer
		- Flooding of a few homes and businesses is likely
		Troouning of a few frontes and businesses is likely
		Yellow warning of wind
		Yellow - Possible
		Areas affected:South West England, Wales
		Starts:04:00 BST Thursday 23 October
		Ends:18:00 BST Thursday 23 October
		Strong northwesterly winds could cause some disruption on Thursday.
		- Some delays to road, rail, air and ferry transport are likely
		- Probably some bus and train services affected, with some journeys taking longer
		- Delays for high-sided vehicles on exposed routes and bridges likely
		- Some short term loss of power and other services is possible
		- It's likely that some coastal routes, sea fronts and coastal communities will be
		affected by spray and/or large waves
		Yellow warning of wind

		Areas affected:East Midlands, East of England, London & South East England,
		Yorkshire & Humber
		Starts:09:00 BST Thursday 23 October
		Ends:23:59 BST Thursday 23 October
		Strong winds may cause travel disruption and some damage across eastern England
		during Thursday.
		- There is a slight chance of some damage to buildings, such as tiles blown from roofs
		- There is a small chance that some roads and bridges could close
		- There is a small chance of longer journey times or cancellations as road, rail, air and
		ferry services are affected
		- There is a slight chance that power cuts may occur, with the potential to affect
		other services, such as mobile phone coverage
		- There is a small chance of injuries and danger to life from flying debris
		- There is a small chance that injuries and danger to life could occur from large waves and beach material being thrown onto sea fronts, coastal roads and properties
