



Latest forecast (Summary)	Met Office SEPA Natural Resources Wales	Persistent rain at times across England and Wales only slowly clearing into the North Sea. Scattered showers elsewhere some heavy and thundery. Widely windy, with severe gales possible along eastern coasts and possibly some western coasts. Feeling colder. Tonight: Rain in the far east slowly clearing, though continuing in parts of eastern Scotland. Showers also in the west, but drier elsewhere with some clear spells. Winds slowly easing.

		services, such as mobile phone coverage
		- There is a small chance of injuries and danger to life from flying debris
		- There is a small chance that injuries and danger to life could occur from large waves
		and beach material being thrown onto sea fronts, coastal roads and properties
