ITEM BR Groupings: Strawman discussion

As agreed at the August JESG meeting, I took an action (as Chair of JESG) to review the information kindly shared by the Department in their presentation with a view to considering where the various items of legislation could fit, in terms of possible (JESG) sub-groups.

I have drawn upon the information in the DESNZ presentation (columns C / D / E / F) and added in the (sub)groupings (column B) based on the thematic areas (“*market oversight, market coupling, market design, system operation, resilience*”) that the Department mentioned as possible options.

Having reflected upon this over the past week or so, I’ve taken the liberty of suggesting a variation on the (sub) groupings (column A) based on the following areas:

1. *Policy & Governance*
2. *Connections & Operations*
3. *Markets & Mechanisms*
4. *Oversight & Compliance*
5. *Security & Resilience*

The reason for suggesting these five (sub) groupings (for column A) is that I think they may fit better into the current industry arrangements (in terms of the type of colleagues who’d be interested in certain EU legislation).
